Executive Summary

The STAND UP International Youth Conference took place in Zagreb, Croatia, from 23 to 26 April 2026. The event brought together young participants from across Europe to explore topics related to Holocaust remembrance, human rights, democracy, inclusion, and active citizenship through interactive workshops, discussions, and educational activities.

The conference aimed to equip participants with educational tools and activity plans developed through the long-standing cooperation between HERMES and the Anne Frank House, building on the results of previous remembrance and Holocaust education programs. It sought to strengthen participants' knowledge of remembrance and human rights education while providing them with the skills and confidence to facilitate these activities in their own schools, communities, and peer groups, encouraging them to become multipliers of democratic values and active citizenship.

The event brought together 48 individuals from 13 countries, including 41 young participants and 7 facilitators, organisers and chaperons. Throughout the conference, participants engaged in interactive workshops, simulations, and discussions, gaining practical experience with a variety of educational tools and methodologies. Participants also developed concrete follow-up plans to implement peer education activities in their local communities after the event.

The conference evaluation demonstrated a very high level of participant satisfaction. Around **94% of respondents stated that the conference met their expectations and contributed to their personal development**, while almost all participants expressed satisfaction with the organisation, accommodation, venue, and catering. Interactive workshops, international exchange, and discussions on democracy, human rights, and Holocaust remembrance were highlighted as the most valuable aspects of the programme.

By the beginning of July 2026, **36 participants had already delivered peer education workshops, reaching more than 780 young people** across several European countries and promoting democracy, human rights, Holocaust remembrance, and inclusion. In the following months, additional participants will continue implementing their planned activities, with further workshops and educational initiatives scheduled for late summer and early autumn.

Background Information

STAND UP International Youth Conference was planned as a multi-day educational programme bringing together 40 young participants from 10 European countries. The conference was designed to focus on peer education, Holocaust remembrance, countering antisemitism, and promoting European values, providing participants with knowledge, tools, and methodologies for organising follow-up peer education activities in their local communities after the event.

Through interactive workshops, discussions, and non-formal education methods, participants were expected to explore innovative approaches to Holocaust education, remembrance, and human rights education, including working with archival materials and exploring local histories and heritage. During the conference, participants were planned to develop concrete ideas and action plans for follow-up activities to be implemented in their communities after returning home. Each participant was expected to organise one to two peer education activities, with the overall aim of reaching a minimum of 1,000 young people through these multiplier activities.

Objectives of the key activity:

- The main objective of the activity was to empower young people to become active multipliers of knowledge and awareness within their communities. By engaging directly in their own learning process and taking responsibility for sharing acquired knowledge with their peers, participants developed skills in facilitation, critical thinking, and civic engagement.
- The activity aimed to increase awareness and sensitivity among young people regarding antisemitism, xenophobia, discrimination, and other forms of intolerance, while strengthening their understanding of the importance of Holocaust remembrance and the protection of democratic European values. By combining historical learning with peer education and youth participation, the conference contributed to creating a network of young educators capable of promoting inclusion, human rights, and active citizenship across Europe.

Conference Agenda

The conference agenda was designed around the presentation and practical implementation of two educational manuals developed through the long-term cooperation between the Anne Frank House and HERMES. The programme combined historical learning with contemporary civic education, allowing participants to explore the connections between understanding the past and engaging with present-day challenges.

The **AFYN Toolkit** focuses primarily on historical learning, with activities centred around the life and fate of Anne Frank, the Holocaust, and broader topics related to historical awareness, remembrance, and human rights education. The second resource, the **Civic Engagement Activity Set**, complements this approach by focusing on contemporary issues, democratic values, civic participation, and empowering young people to become active citizens in their communities.

Through the combination of both educational approaches, participants were encouraged to reflect on historical experiences while developing the knowledge, skills, and confidence needed to promote democracy, inclusion, and human rights in their own communities. The agenda below presents the structure of the conference and the activities implemented throughout the programme.

Thursday, April 23rd

Meeting in Zagreb city centre & group dinner

Participants arrived in Zagreb and gathered in the city centre before travelling together to the accommodation venue on the hills above Zagreb (Tomislavov dom on Sljeme). The evening continued with a group dinner, providing a relaxed opportunity for participants to meet each other, exchange first impressions, and begin building connections within the group. This informal introduction helped create a welcoming atmosphere and prepare participants for the activities ahead.

Getting to know each other (Animal Farm)

Through the Animal Farm icebreaking activity, participants engaged in an interactive getting-to-know-each-other exercise designed to encourage communication, openness, and teamwork. The activity helped create a safe and inclusive atmosphere, allowing participants to become more comfortable with each other and establish the foundations for collaboration during the following days.

Friday, April 24th

Welcome & icebreakers

The first session introduced participants to the programme, objectives, code of conduct and practical information about the event. Through interactive ice-breaking activities, participants had the opportunity to get to know each other, share expectations, and reflect on their current state of mind, creating a positive and supportive group atmosphere. The activities covered were speed dating; “photo from the phone” conversational activity; and “state of mind” collective brainstorm, whereby everyone contributed to two flip charts - one that invited ‘what gives me hope’ and one that invited ‘what concerns me about the world today’.

Presentation of Anne Frank Youth Network activities & opportunities

The icebreakers were followed by a brief interactive presentation of the AFYN network and its different activities, and opportunities for youth in becoming active members and contributors.

Group dialogue: What’s going on in the world and what’s history got to do with it?

Combining Bohm dialogue principles and Democracy Dialogues - DEMOS dialogic approach developed by HERMES and partners (www.democracydialogues.eu), youth engaged in 90 minutes long dialogue that reflected on their previous contributions to ‘state of the world’ flipcharts. It was an engaging dialogue that allowed young people to reflect on not just the past, but also current conflicts, which in turn led to further reflections on examining the patterns in human collective and individual behaviours that lead to and foster conflicts. The dialogue ended on a note of personal examination on individual’s and youth’s role in making their schools, communities a better place, and positively impacting the world.

AFYN Toolkit Activity 1: Short Life of Anne Frank & Quiz

After lunch, participants watched the 20-min video “Short Life of Anne Frank” that guides viewers through the 1930s events in Europe, and Anne’s life story. Following this film, they took part in an engaging Kahoot quiz to check how much of the information from the short film they managed to absorb.

AFYN Toolkit Activity 2: The Faces of the Third Reich

In this activity, using photographs and imagery, participants are asked to analyse individuals’ photos, and to assume what their role was during World War 2. The activity explores our assumptions and beliefs, inviting a conversation on individual roles (helpers, bystanders, victims, perpetrators) in times of conflict, and how they can transform and become dynamic over time.

Zagreb Excursion

The second part of the afternoon and evening was dedicated to visiting Zagreb, going to city (and back) with a scenic cable car ride; having a guided tour of the historical city centre; and having dinner in town.

Saturday, April 25th

Civic Engagement activity 1: Introducing Democracy & Between Theory and Practice: Human Rights

This session introduced participants to key concepts related to democracy, human rights, and civic participation. Through interactive exercises, participants explored how democratic values can be translated into everyday actions and community engagement.

Civic Engagement activity 2: Basic Democracy Dilemma: Freedom of Speech

Participants explored the challenges and dilemmas surrounding freedom of speech in democratic societies. Through practical activities and discussions, they developed their ability to analyse different perspectives and engage in respectful dialogue.

Pedagogy troubleshooting: group activity

This group activity focused on challenges that may arise when working in educational settings with young people. Participants shared experiences, exchanged practical solutions, and reflected on effective approaches to facilitation and non-formal education.

Group dialogue: Making a difference

The session explored the concepts of civic duty, civic engagement, and youth participation. Using interactive methods and discussion tools, participants reflected on their own role in society and identified ways young people can contribute to positive change.

Planning their own follow-up peer education activities

Participants developed concrete plans for follow-up activities to be implemented in their local communities after the event. They adapted the methods and tools introduced during the programme to their own contexts, ensuring that the knowledge gained would have a wider impact.

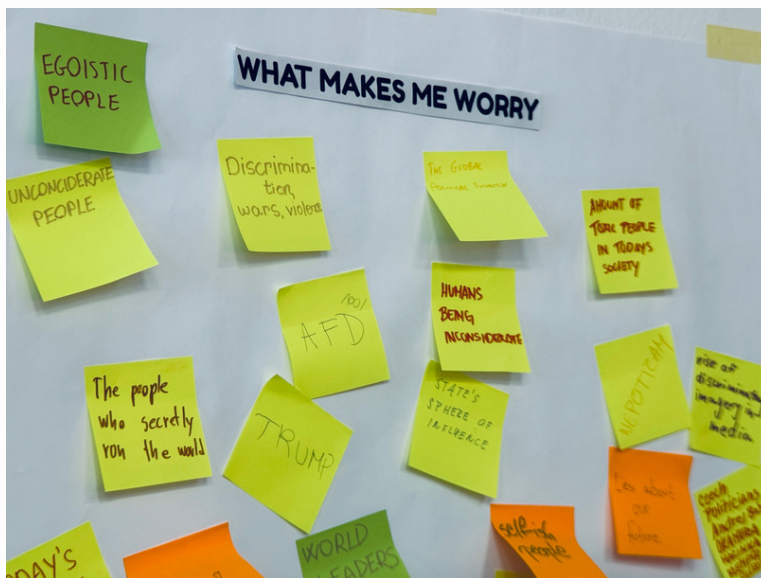
Evaluation, certificates, closing

The closing session provided space for participants to reflect on their learning outcomes, share feedback, and evaluate the overall experience. Certificates were distributed, and participants discussed opportunities for continued cooperation and future engagement.

Evaluation

At the conclusion of the conference, participants were invited to complete an evaluation questionnaire to assess the quality, organisation, and overall impact of the event. The feedback was highly positive, demonstrating an excellent level of participant satisfaction and confirming that the conference successfully met its objectives.

Participants expressed a very high level of satisfaction with the overall organization of the seminar. **Nearly 100%** of respondents were satisfied with the accommodation, conference venue, and catering, with only a few suggestions for a wider selection of fresh fruit and vegetables.

The seminar successfully met participants' expectations and contributed to their personal development:

- **94%** stated that the seminar **contributed to their personal development**;
- **94%** reported that **the seminar met their expectations**.

The most frequently highlighted positive aspects included:

- Interactive workshops;
- The exchange of experiences with young people from different countries;
- Opportunities to meet new people and learn about different cultures;
- Discussions on democracy, human rights and Holocaust remembrance.

Perceived impact & feedback

Participants reported high levels of agreement (5-point scale) with all learning outcomes.

- Increased interest in civic/community engagement: 4.42 / 5
- Greater confidence discussing human rights and social issues: 4.39 / 5
- Feeling prepared to take action in their communities: 4.42 / 5
- Better equipped to discuss complex societal issues: 4.22 / 5
- *"I found the workshops the most interesting because they are very engaging which is more and more rare to find."*
- *"Meeting people from different cultures and learning more about the latter."*
- *"The debates about political situation, because I heard the view from the countries all around the Balkans."*
- *"The activity where we were given pictures of historical figures and we had to write down our first impression and then got to know their true identities afterwards. It's interesting because it reminded us that you should never judge a book by its cover."*
- *"It was a wonderful experience and I made lovely connections. Thank you!"*

The evaluation indicates that the seminar was highly successful. Participants particularly appreciated the quality of the workshops, the international exchange of experiences and the networking opportunities. The feedback also suggests room for further improvement by offering more advanced content for experienced participants and making minor organizational enhancements.

Conclusion

For organising team, the STAND UP International Youth Conference was a highly rewarding experience, but also a demanding process that required extensive preparation, coordination, and flexibility. One of the main challenges was ensuring that all participants' needs were met while maintaining a high quality of implementation, particularly regarding accommodation, travel arrangements, meals, and overall participant support. This was especially important as some of the participants were minors, which required additional attention, responsibility, pre-during-and post-event safeguarding principles, and careful coordination. Moreover, bringing together participants from different parts of Europe involved complex travel arrangements, with some participants travelling for more than eight hours and coming from remote locations with limited transport connections.

Throughout the preparation and implementation phases, HERMES team worked closely with participants and partner organisations to address individual needs, provide clear information, and ensure a safe and inclusive environment for everyone involved. While the logistical aspects required significant effort and continuous problem-solving, seeing participants actively engage in the programme and build connections across countries demonstrated the value of investing time and resources into creating such learning opportunities.

One of the more challenging aspects of the post-conference period was monitoring and tracking the implementation of follow-up activities. Since participants were implementing activities in different countries and contexts, maintaining regular communication and collecting updates required continuous follow-up, reminders, and encouragement from our side. Although this process was more time-consuming than initially expected, the final results showed that these efforts were worthwhile. Participants successfully implemented peer education activities, reached young people in their communities, and continued spreading the knowledge and methods gained during the conference.

At the moment, the follow-up period is still ongoing and is progressing largely according to the initial plan. A significant number of participants have already implemented their activities, while others are currently in the preparation phase. For some participants, organising local activities requires additional time, coordination, and effort, particularly when it comes to gathering participants, securing venues, and adapting the activities to their local contexts. Therefore, a further set of peer education activities is expected to take place during the upcoming months.

In parallel with monitoring the follow-up phase, we are also exploring, together with the Anne Frank House, opportunities to further engage participants who showed strong motivation and interest in continuing their involvement. Our aim is to create additional opportunities for active and interested participants to become more deeply involved in the Anne Frank Youth Network, strengthen their capacities as peer educators, and continue contributing to activities related to Holocaust remembrance, human rights education, and combating intolerance. These future opportunities will help ensure that the connections, knowledge, and motivation created during the STAND UP conference continue beyond the project period and develop into longer-term engagement within the network.

The STAND UP project represents an important part of HERMES' work during the 2025–2026 period, as it closely aligns with our mission of promoting human rights, democratic values, active citizenship, and innovative educational approaches. By combining Holocaust remembrance education with civic engagement and youth participation, the project contributes to our long-term goal of empowering young people to become active multipliers who can address intolerance, antisemitism, discrimination, and other challenges in their communities.

Looking ahead, we anticipate that the follow-up period will focus not only on completing and documenting participants' local activities but also on maintaining the network and connections established during the conference. The experience confirmed for our team that, despite the organisational challenges, international youth programmes such as STAND UP create meaningful and lasting impact. The dedication of participants, the quality of their follow-up activities, and the connections built throughout the process showed that the effort invested in organising the conference was truly worthwhile.

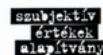

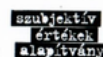

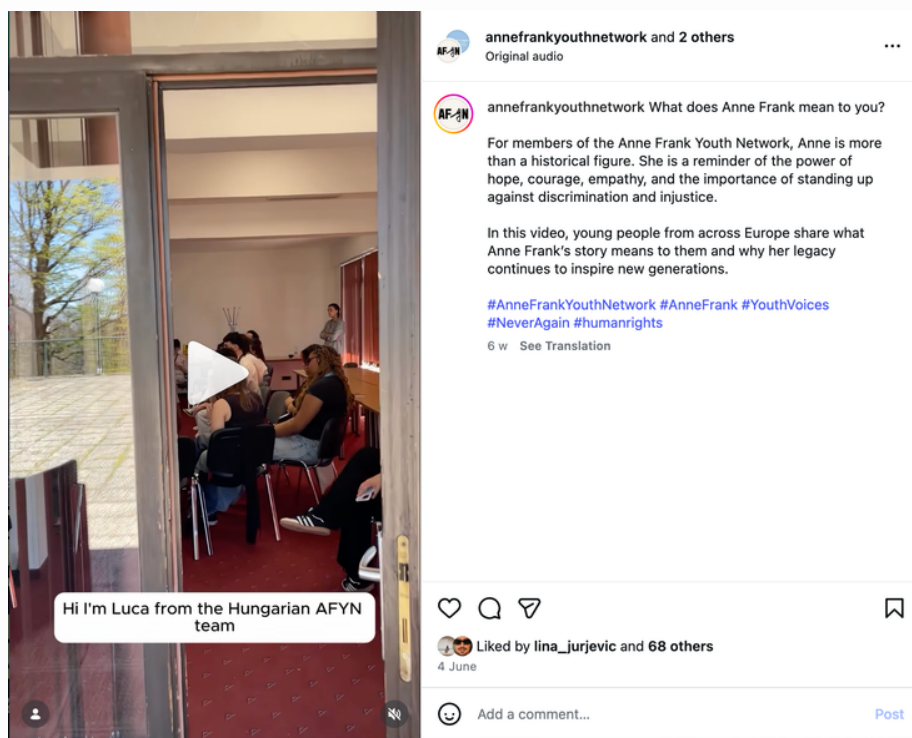
