Description

Location 1 – Gimnazija Vladimira Nazora, Zadar

At Gimnazija Vladimira Nazora in Zadar, the Anne Frank – A History for Today exhibition took place from 20 January 2026 to 6 February 2026, following the peer guide training held on 16–17 January 2026. A total of 12 peer guides participated in the project. The exhibition included an estimated 18 guided groups, with an average of 20 students per group, reaching approximately 360 guided visitors and an additional 50 individual visitors, for a total estimated number of 410 visitors. Students evaluated the exhibition very positively, emphasizing the importance of learning about Anne Frank's life, the Holocaust, human rights, tolerance, and the consequences of discrimination. They highlighted that the exhibition provided an opportunity to reflect on historical events through personal stories and to better understand the importance of empathy, respect, and responsibility in today's society.

Location 2 – Prirodoslovna škola Split, Split

Following the peer guide training held on 20–21 February 2026, the exhibition was presented at Prirodoslovna škola Split from 2 March 2026 to 25 March 2026. The project involved 18 peer guides. During the exhibition period, 32 guided groups visited the exhibition, with an average of 20 students per group, resulting in approximately 640 guided visitors and an additional 20 individual visitors, or 660 visitors in total. Students responded positively to the exhibition, particularly valuing the personal perspective of Anne Frank's story and the way historical events were presented through individual experiences. They emphasized that the exhibition encouraged critical thinking about prejudice, discrimination, tolerance, and the importance of protecting human rights. Students also appreciated the opportunity to engage with the topic in an interactive way and deepen their understanding of the historical context.

Location 3 – Ekonomsko-turistička škola Karlovac, Karlovac

In Karlovac, the exhibition was organized at Ekonomsko-turistička škola Karlovac from 18 May 2026 to 5 June 2026, after the peer guide training conducted on 14–15 May 2026. The activity involved 11 peer guides. The exhibition welcomed an estimated 300 visitors. Students described the exhibition as a meaningful and engaging experience, especially appreciating the connection between historical events and personal stories. They noted that the exhibition encouraged reflection and discussion, helping them better understand how individual experiences can provide insight into broader historical processes.

Location 4 – Tehnoart Secondary School, Belgrade

In Belgrade, the Tehnoart Secondary School hosted the exhibition from 9 March 2026 to 25 March 2026, following the peer guide training held on 7–8 March 2026. A total of 11 peer guides participated in the project. The exhibition consisted of 20 guided tours, with approximately 25 visitors per tour, reaching 500 guided visitors and an estimated 20 individual visitors, for a total of 520 visitors. Students valued the opportunity to actively present historical content and communicate with visitors. They highlighted that guiding the exhibition helped them develop confidence in public speaking, improve their communication skills, and create a stronger personal connection with themes related to history, memory, and social responsibility.

Location 5 – Ekonomsko-ugostiteljska škola „Vuk Karadžić“, Velika Plana

The exhibition in Velika Plana, hosted by Ekonomsko-ugostiteljska škola „Vuk Karadžić“, was organized from 24 March 2026 to 3 April 2026, following the peer guide training held on 21–23 March 2026. A total of 12 peer guides were trained for the exhibition. The programme included 9 guided tours, with approximately 70 visitors per tour, reaching a total of 615 guided visitors. Students actively participated in presenting the exhibition and sharing its key messages, using the opportunity to strengthen their understanding of historical events and discuss the importance of tolerance, human rights, and remembrance.

Summary

The Anne Frank – A History for Today exhibition was presented in 5 locations across Croatia and Serbia. A total of 66 peer guides were trained to support the implementation of the exhibitions. Based on the available data, the exhibitions reached a total of 2,505 visitors: 410 visitors in Zadar, 660 in Split, 300 in Karlovac, 520 in Belgrade, and 615 in Velika Plana.
